Working topics: NC Quakers, the Abolitionist Movement and Civil Rights. Finance Committee - Jo Ann Fernald

Jo Ann reviewed changes in the updated budget proposal from last month, noting that givings to SAYMA was corrected from 20 % to 22 % of unrestricted budget. If more money is donated later in the year than anticipated, Finance can revise the budget to reflect changes. The **Proposed Budget 10 01 2020 – 09-30-2021was approved without objections.** Other budget documents were reviewed and approved. Meeting. expressed appreciation to Jo Ann and the committee for their hard work on budget issues. **See Addendums Below**

SAYMA Budget for FY 2021

Catherine Peck, our SAYMA representative, reviewed items from the SAYMA proposed budget, noting that \$2500 was included for the Uplifting Racial Justice Committee. By a minute approved earlier by Celo Friends Meeting, Catherine Peck, our rep, will not approve any spending for URJ until problems with URJ have been cleared.

Also noted in the SAYMA budget is money for a "Transformation" group from NY. This group has not been seasoned by key SAYMA people and there are apparent conflicts of interest between board members of this group and SAYMA URJ.

Brain Yaffe as Celo Rep to Ministry and Nurture of SAYMA will not approved that item. Friends were troubled by non-transparent, unfriendly process apparently used at the SAYMA discussions. Friends will check on deadline (October 1?) for SAYMA budget.

Friends expressed appreciation to Barbara Esther and Bob McGahey for their letters on exiting and entering SAYMA leadership positions.

Sixth Month Minutes approved as read.

Ministry and Care:

Query: How willing am I to be led by the Light, and does anything hinder that willingness?

Sara Ann and Jason's wedding: They will marry on the slab, tentatively the second Tuesday in October, with a group of 10 in attendance. Brian, clearness/support committee convenor, is exploring possibilities of Zoom attendance for those who would like to witness the wedding.

The Meeting's new Uplifting Racial Justice Committee met this past week, and will meet weekly on Wednesdays for the near future. Catherine Peck is the convenor.

We affirm that we are not approving further funds for SAYMA URJ, until our minuted concerns are addressed.

Treasurer: Draft 2020-21 budget, first reading (see attached)

Our upcoming budget includes significant reductions in SAYMA givings (the guideline is 20% of unrestricted funds), travel/scholarship, and building and grounds.

We held a vigorous discussion of the SAYMA reduction. 33% seemed to some like a big hit. We discussed willingness to amend the budget as the year goes on to increase our contribution. Friends are asked to be aware of the Meeting's financial needs. A former treasurer noted that the amount we agreed to give SAYMA was not 20%, but 22% of unrestricted funds. One suggestion was to redistribute funds to give \$300 more, or \$2700 for SAYMA

(versus last year's 3500). The Treasurer will again ask committee clerks if they can cut a bit more to come up with the 300 differential before our August meeting. After hearing from committee clerks, the Treasurer will bring two budgets to our next meeting, the original and one that reflects additional cuts to other line items.

Margithaus Committee. Reopening of Children's Garden Preschool: As the school year evolves, the committee will support problem-solving for emerging issues. Mari's plan is to stay outdoors for entire school year, due to coronavirus. She has found the Childcare Toolkit from the state helpful. Many safety precautions, including handwashing station near the outhouse. (Or a portable tripod for warm months) The preschool will be closed in December for winter break. Mari will monitor the situation as winter's weather pattern emerges. She will employ handwarmers, hot water bottles, and layers of clothing to help keep children warm, as well as providing warm snacks. As long as the school does not use Margithaus, the rent will be \$50 a month plus \$7 for phone. This will go towards using the playground, outhouse, parking lot, the adjacent outside Firstday building, and the meetinghouse porch in inclement weather. We are holding Mari and the school in the Light during this challenging situation.

Rachel has encountered problems with the washing machine, but she is coping as best she can. A dead tree and a large limb need cutting near the old meetinghouse. Generally, folks are not using the meetinghouse for meditation. Margithaus report accepted.

<u>Adult Religious Education</u>: Three Friendly 8's continue to meet by Zoom. They have been focusing on racism during the past month. Groups remain open for others to join.

Joyce wants someone to take her place as advisor to high school students about CO status. This person would work with Herbie going forward, as Joyce has for many decades.

<u>Announcements:</u> Charlotte Schreiber, benefactor of Margithaus and Meeting House, died peacefully in Seattle during this past week. We also mourn John Lewis's passing, a dedicated civil rights champion and longtime Georgia congressman, as well as the passing of CT Vivian, organizer of the Freedom Riders.
